Welcome to RETURN Africa, where each journey is shaped by heritage, wildness, and the joy of discovery.

Our story began in 2014, when we were entrusted by the Makuleke in the far north of Kruger National Park. Here, where rivers meet and ancient paths cross, we restored Pafuri Camp, breathed new life into Baobab Hill House, and built two simple camps, Hutwini & Nkula, for walking safaris.

Together, these became the Pafuri Collection. A place where guests walk with guides through fever tree forests, watch the Luvuvhu River flood and retreat, and feel the deep rhythm of Africa beneath their feet.

In 2017, we carried this spirit south to Cape Town, opening Welgelegen House, a serene boutique hotel on the slopes of Table Mountain, and later An African Story, a remarkable Camps Bay villa. Both offer a base for exploring the Cape's history, coastline, and culture, different in setting, but bound by the same RETURN Africa philosophy: connection, care, and presence.

Responsible travel is not a promise for tomorrow; it is woven into what we do today. From solar power and water recycling in Pafuri to sourcing responsibly and minimising waste, our commitment is to protect the landscapes and communities that make these journeys possible.

Through every property and every experience, we invite you to RETURN to what matters: to slow down, to listen, to reconnect with nature, and to feel the vitality of Africa in its truest form. Whether it's the thrill of spotting a Pel's fishing owl in the Makuleke Ramsar wetlands or the quiet of Cape Town at dawn, RETURN Africa is about moments that linger long after you've gone home.

Pafuri Camp:

Sited beneath the riverine trees, each luxurious tent at Pafuri Camp rests on the banks of the Luvuvhu River. Here, the boundary between the Makuleke Contractual Park and Kruger fades away, leaving only wild beauty. Days unfold in rhythm with the bush – morning and evening drives, or guided walks along ancient elephant paths. Between adventures, you'll find shady decks for al-fresco meals, a pool for cooling off, and quiet corners where the river constantly entertains with the movement of birds, elephants, and crocodiles.

Pafuri Walking Safaris:

To walk in Pafuri is to step into a story written across millennia. With few roads, the concession offers vast, uninterrupted space where your guide might point out a Stone Age hand axe or the remains of a Makuleke hearth. Tucked beneath giant trees, its spacious tents come with outdoor showers and flush loos, while the elegant mess tent invites shared meals and fireside conversation. Close to the Luvuvhu River, al-fresco dining under the stars feels as much a part of the wilderness as the landscapes walked each day.

Nkula Walking Camp:

Nkula offers a simpler, earthier take on the walking safari. Shaded by magnificent Natal Mahogany trees.. The camp carries the same essential comforts as Hutwini, but with an easy, unpretentious atmosphere. It's an authentic way to experience the bush, pared back to what matters most: nature, silence, and connection.

Baobab Hill House:

For those seeking privacy, Baobab Hill House stands alone on a ridge north of the Luvuvhu, shaded by ancient baobabs and steeped in history. Once the ranger's homestead, today it's a welcoming retreat with four bedrooms, open living spaces, and a wide veranda made for long afternoons and starry nights. With your own guide, vehicle, cook, and housekeeping team, Baobab Hill House feels both homely and exclusive. Self-cater or let us take care of everything – either way, the land around you is yours to explore.
